MONETARY DONATIONS NEEDED TO HELP SAVE THE LIVES OF SEVEN PUPPIES

The Mission Viejo Animal Services Center is seeking donations to help save the lives of seven puppies rescued from the desert.

On June 6, staff transferred the 6-week-old puppies and their mom from the Coachella Valley Animal Shelter to our center through the "Mission for Home Rescue Program" funded by the nonprofit DAWG.

All puppies and mom initially seemed healthy, but over the last six days, each pup has developed upper-respiratory symptoms and pneumonia.

"Three of our wonderful local veterinarians have begun hospitalization during the day, and two of our local emergency hospitals are caring for them overnight, but all seven need extensive 24-hour supportive care including multiple antibiotics, IV fluids, radiographs, and nebulization to help them breathe," said Animal Services Director Brynn Lavison. "Although our partner veterinarians are very generous with discounting their services for our homeless pets, the treatment for all seven pups will be extensive. Our shelter

and DAWG are committed to their care, but we cannot do it alone."

PACIFIC SYMPHONY AND CARL ST. CLAIR'S STORIED LEGACY IS ON DISPLAY AT JOHN WAYNE AIRPORT

To culminate a milestone season celebrating Music Director Carl St. Clair's 35-year career, Pacific Symphony's remarkable history in Orange County is being featured in a curated exhibit at John Wayne Airport presented by the Airport Arts Commission. Now on display until October 13, 2025, visitors can explore the Symphony's evolution from a regional ensemble to one of the nation's leading orchestras. Performing music that inspires, entertains and heals, Pacific Symphony is a beacon of artistic achievement both at home and abroad and this exhibit captures the heart of its mission. This inviting exhibition is on view at the airport's Destination Gallery, located on the non-secure pedestrian bridge connecting Terminals B and C.

"We're grateful to John Wayne Airport for helping us share the story of Pacific Symphony in a highly visible public display as we celebrate Carl St. Clair and look toward a vibrant future building on his legacy," said John Forsythe, President and CEO of Pacific Symphony. Over the past 35 years, St. Clair has orchestrated a vision of joy and excellence—leading Pacific Symphony through challenging repertoire alongside luminaries including Yo-Yo Ma, Lang Lang and John Williams, to acclaimed and up-and-coming musicians from across the globe. Pacific Symphony is known internationally through major tours in Europe and China, its Carnegie Hall debut, and a PBS Great Performances special broadcast globally. St. Clair has also brought opera back to Orange County through yearly semi-staged productions featuring world-class opera stars, as well as

created traditions through holiday concerts including the Lunar New Year and Nowruz concerts, and Handel's "Messiah."

"This exhibit is a tribute to the incredible journey Pacific Symphony has taken under Carl St. Clair's leadership," said MC Sungaila, Pacific Symphony Board member, member of the John Wayne Airport Arts Commission, and partner at Complex Appellate Litigation Group. "As a long-time Orange County resident and admirer of orchestral music, it was important to me that we share this journey with the broader community—travelers and residents alike. John Wayne Airport is the perfect place to showcase how far the Symphony has come and where it's headed next."

This engaging retrospective invites travelers and locals alike to learn more about the orchestra that has shaped the musical heart of Orange

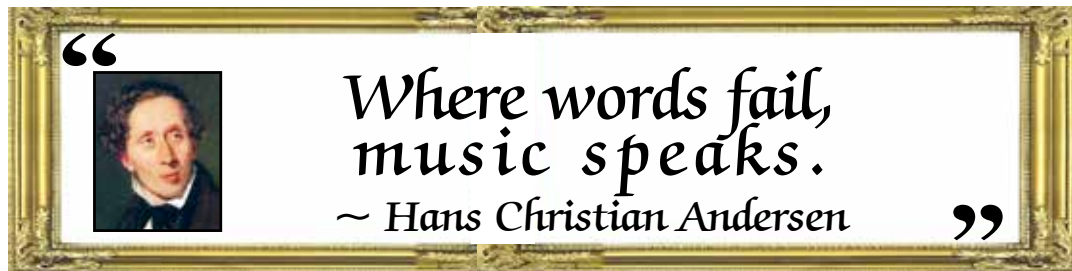

Taste of Wine & Food

A.R. VALENTIEN'S GRAND RETURN AT THE LODGE AT TORREY PINES

With sweeping views of the Pacific and the iconic 18th hole of Torrey Pines Golf Course, A.R. Valentien at The Lodge at Torrey Pines has long stood as a beacon of refined California cuisine. After a seven-month renovation, the signature restaurant has reopened, seamlessly blending tradition and modern elegance. Guests arriving at The Lodge are greeted with the warm, inviting aroma of oak and eucalyptus drifting from the wood-fired grill.

Guests can now enjoy a refreshed Craftsman-style dining room and al fresco terrace, surrounded by native pine trees and original works of early 20th-century California artist A.R. Valentien, for whom the restaurant is named. Enhancements to the kitchen include dedicated pastry and butcher spaces, upgraded lighting, and equipment that allows Executive Chef Kelli Crosson and her team to elevate every detail of the guest experience. As Crosson puts it, the updates ensure a space where "creativity, precision, and joy" flourish.

Equally exciting is the debut of Sommelier and new restaurant manager Schuyler Munroe. Building on the foundation laid by Paul Krikorian, Munroe continues offering rare and allocated wines while curating thoughtful pairings that elevate Chef Crosson's dishes. He is also launching a special section of the wine list dedicated to vineyards in the California Historic Vineyard Society. One such feature is a wine from Morgan Twain Peterson's Bedrock Wine Co., whose vineyard traces roots to the 1850s and is one of California's oldest. Munroe shared how the Lodge's connection to California heritage inspired this direction, and how honoring this legacy through wine enhances the overall dining journey.

Our evening began with a warm welcome from lead server Dean Dugger and a gracious offer from Far Niente's President of Sales, Bruce Mooers, who we previously met, shared

a pour of Far Niente Pinot Noir from his nearby table where he was holding a business meeting. It was a delightful opening to an unforgettable night.

We were first treated to an amuse bouche, followed by a thyme cornbread biscuit served with Straus Organic Creamery butter, easily one of the finest biscuits I've had. The biscuit was perfectly warm, with a slightly crisp exterior and pillowy soft center, and the butter added a creamy richness that highlighted its savory thyme flavor. For appetizers, the seared sea scallop and trout caviar, harmonized beautifully with the Baja shrimp marinated in Piment d'Espelette, served with fava beans, green garlic, arugula, and Shaner Family Farms tangerines.

Our salad course featured the Blackberry Salad with soft lettuces, fresh blackberries, pecans, and whipped St. André Creamery cow's milk cheese, tied together with a delicate sherry honey vinaigrette.

For entrées, the Chanterelle Crusted Northern Halibut shined, accompanied by an asparagus and chanterelle ragu with lemon and tarragon beurre blanc. The halibut was delicate and flaky, and the chanterelle crust added a savory earthiness. The 12oz Brandt Beef Prime Ribeye was cooked to a perfect medium-rare and paired with a savory market onion tart, sautéed mustard greens, and truffle butter. We also enjoyed two sides: the Herb Baked Burrata with marinated artichokes, basil, lemon, and grilled focaccia along with the roasted beets topped with rich pistachio butter. Staying on the Far Niente Pinot theme, we selected EnRoute Pinot Noir for our main course, a flawless match.

Dessert was simple yet satisfying, a slice of brown butter cake crowned with a scoop of house made creamsicle ice cream and a crumble garnish. The cake had a light citrus note and the texture was just the right balance between dense and moist.

Service Manager Gabriel de Maria y Campos shared a few additional touches that reinforce A.R. Valentien's commitment to excellence. Each guest begins with a complimentary amuse bouche, grilled seasonal vegetables such as torpedo onions with caper gremolata, and Mignardises, petite confections that end the meal on a sweet note. These additions vary daily, further underscoring the restaurant's commitment to freshness and thoughtful hospitality.

With service that addressed us formally by last name, a kitchen that refuses to compromise on quality, and a wine program steeped in history and care, A.R. Valentien is delivering a dining experience worthy of Michelin consideration. I'll go on record now, this team is charting a course straight toward a Michelin star. They've earned it. - 1/3 cup dry breadcrumbs
- 3 tablespoons lime juice
- 1 tablespoon chili powder
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cumin
- 2 cans (15 ounces each) black beans, rinsed, drained and patted dry
- 2 eggs
- olive oil cooking spray
- 8 wheat burger buns, toasted
- lettuce leaves (optional)
- 2 ripe avocados, peeled, pitted and sliced

To prepare salsa: In grill basket over medium-high heat, grill grapes, onion and jalapeno pepper 10 minutes until lightly charred, stirring occasionally. Let cool then place in food processor with cilantro, lime juice and garlic. Process until finely chopped.

To prepare burgers: In food processor, pulse lentils, rice, walnuts, onion, breadcrumbs, lime juice, chili powder, cumin, beans and eggs until coarsely chopped with some small pieces still visible, scraping down sides and moving mixture from bottom of bowl to top to blend evenly.

Using wet or lightly oiled hands, shape into eight patties. If mixture is too soft, freeze briefly to firm. Coat on both sides with olive oil spray and, in two skillet over medium heat, cook 10 minutes, turning occasionally and coating with additional olive oil spray. Burgers should be browned and cooked through.

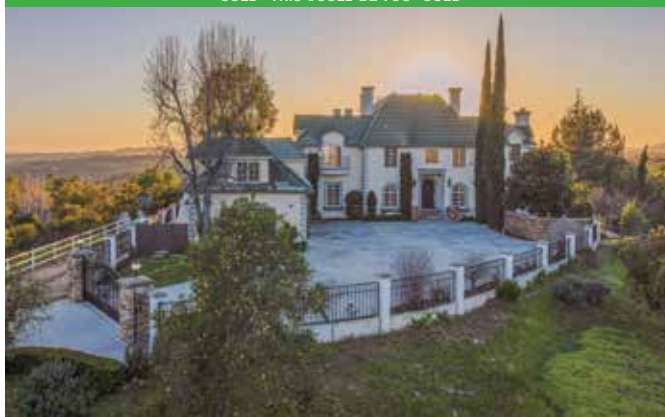

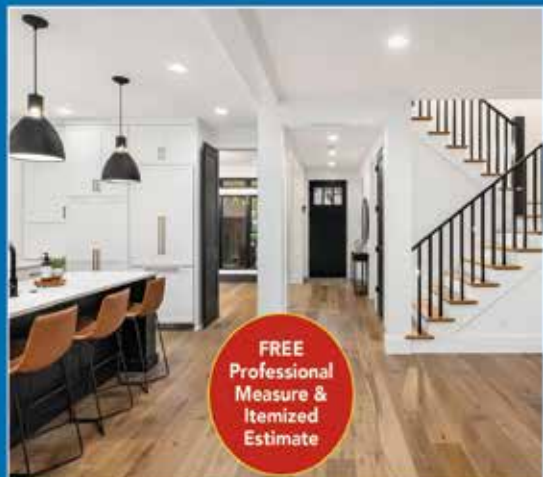
